CLIMATE SMART: Did you know? Light Pollution causes serious ecological damage. It harms many species, including migratory birds, pollinators, and mammals who rely on the light of the sun and the moon to orient themselves. Artificial light confuses these instincts and biodiversity declines. You can make a real impact on our natural environment by paying attention to your outdoor lighting.

- **Turn off your outdoor lights when they're not needed.** Motion detectors and timers can help reduce light pollution.
- **Direct light where it's most useful.** Aim lights towards areas that enhance nighttime safety, for example towards the ground at walking paths
- **Use “Warm” color lights.** LED light bulbs come colors ranging from “warm” to “daylight”. Warm lights, with a 2700k color index are the least harmful.
